

#### Provide Adequate Funding and Resources for Georgia's Students

- Fund the K-12 funding formula and limit the diversions of public funds to private education entities.
- Provide students with high-quality academic, behavior, and mental health support services.
- Provide funding to support school safety concerns.
- Expand 21st-century instructional technology to include broadband internet, virtual educational opportunities, and digital solutions to personalize student learning, and increasing professional knowledge on Artificial Intelligence (AI).
- Increase funding for Regional Education Service Agencies (RESAs) to increase educator collaboration and professional learning to support student learning.

### Provide High-Quality Teachers and Leaders to Serve Georgia's Students

- Promote teaching as a profession.
- Recruit and retain high-quality teachers and leaders by maintaining a defined benefit retirement system and through educator tax credits.
- Retain high-quality teachers and leaders through internships, mentoring, and job-embedded professional learning.
- Ensure teacher and leader effectiveness measures are valid, reliable, and consistent.
- Include teachers and leaders in the development and implementation of compensation models which use experience and degrees.

### **Support Local School Board Authority**

- Protect local control regarding the selection, purchase, and implementation of curriculum and instructional resources to implement state standards.
- Support the professional judgment, content expertise, and authority of Georgia's teachers, leaders, and local school board members.
